Industries must now be able to demonstrate compliance with the Dangerous Goods (Storage & Handling) Regulations 2000 or face significant fines. Compliance includes providing appropriate training for your staff who use or handle dangerous goods, and that appropriate training has been provided in the areas of hazard identification, risk control mechanisms and risk assessment.
