





Environment Protection Authority Victoria (EPA) is the state's independent environmental regulator.


We work with community, industry and business to prevent and reduce the harmful effects of pollution and waste on Victoria's environment and people.



Preventing harm by making risk management a positive legal obligation




1970 Act focus

Protecting human health and the environment by punishing polluters that cause harm



# EPA's regulatory approach

- Raise awareness and build knowledge
- Work with industry on what compliance looks like
- If we see non-compliance, our response will be measured and proportionate
- Deliberate and criminal non-compliance will be taken seriously

## EPA's harms-led regulatory priorities



Reducing the impacts to air quality from emissions from large industrial activities.



Reducing the impacts to waterways from the discharge of wastes from wastewater treatment plants.



Preventing fires at high-risk waste and resource recovery activities.



Reducing the impacts from poor waste and stormwater management practices at small industry in urban areas.



Disrupting illicit waste markets and the strengthening of legitimate waste markets.






Figure 3 Escalated and responsive approach to enforcement

## Compliance and enforcement activity

## 8,620 inspections under the new EP Act



72 criminal prosecutions on the go 91 matters in Magistrates' Court **Full force** of the law (including litter court election) 28 infringements for failing to report on **Graduated and** 76 environmental infringements requirement compliance proportionate sanctions (excluding litter fines) 777 notices issued based 2,333 directions and **Directed compliance** on breach of the GED remedial notices issued 3,959 compliance **Assisted compliance** advices provided





# Guideline for minimising greenhouse gas emissions - 2048

Publication 2048

#### What it contains

This guideline will help businesses minimise risks to Victoria's environment and human health from their greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.

GHG emissions contribute to climate change risks. You can help reduce climate change risks by eliminating or reducing your GHG emissions.

This guideline will help businesses:

- meet their responsibilities under the Environment Protection Act 2017 and general environmental duty (GED)
- understand how to identify and assess their GHG emissions and put in place reasonably practicable controls to minimise them.


#### 2020-22 small business program pilot


- automotive repair & maintenance businesses (with Victorian Automative Chamber of Commerce)




Directed compliance – remedial notices

Continuing to fine tune the waste framework with legislative instruments or EPA positions to assist industry.



Used Lead Acid Battery (ULAB) designation to be made early this year.



Support for cement additives as fly ash from coal fired power station is underway





## Update - chemicals regulation

#### Industrial Chemicals Environmental Management Standard (IChEMS) framework cont.

- Victoria committed to implementation; to be evaluated over 2023 and 2024
- Regulatory Impact Statement likely; opportunity for input
- Implementation will focus proportionately on chemicals in higher schedules
- IChEMS will build on approaches to managing chemicals under other regulatory frameworks.
